After the summer holidays you will be in Year 6!

You will also have teaching assistants to help you with your work.

In Year 6 you go to the playground in the morning and play until the whistle goes.

Then, when the whistle blows you walk into school through the cloakroom just as you did in Year 5, put your things on the peg which has your name on it and go into class.



The classroom looks the same as Y5 class, there is still a carpet, tables and chairs.

They still have all the usual things like computers there too.



The teacher calls the register and then asks what sort of lunch you are having.

The menu is the same as in Year 5 and you can still bring your own packed lunch from home if you wish.

You do work in literacy and numeracy groups, just like Year 5, but the teacher may change the people a bit.

The teacher will tell you where to sit at first.

The toilets are situated in the same place off the classroom just like Y5.

There is also a water fountain in the corridor, to fill your bottle.

At lunchtime you go out to play when your lessons are finished. The first bell will ring when the hall is clear. When you see the Y6 board, you line up by the junior entrance. School dinners line up first with home packed lunches behind. Each week the order changes so you have to look out for the right board.



If you are having a school dinner you get it in just the same way as you did in Y5. Then, whether you are a packed lunch or school dinner you find somewhere to sit with your friends and eat your lunch.

When you finish you go back out to play until the whistle blows.

When the whistle goes, you do not need to line up just walk quietly into class through Y6 cloakroom.

In the afternoon you do more work but no afternoon play.

The day finishes at 3.20 p.m. and you collect your things and meet your parent on the playground.

There will be some homework in Year 6 but the teacher will explain to you what you have to do and when you should bring it back.

Although there are some changes as you move to Year 6, it is fine when you get used to it and everyone is happy to help, so if you are feeling anxious just tell someone and they should be able to sort out your problem.
