




Hello Everyone!

(You could make a papier mache egg if you are a bit short of eggs)</p>  <p>Try to take a picture of your creation so we can share all the different ideas. .</p>	<p>The classic Egg Drop Challenge Can you drop an egg without it breaking? Choose a height and use any materials you have at home to design a carrier for your egg. Will it survive the fall? Compete with your family to see who can be most successful!</p> 	<p>Make an Easter card for your next door neighbour or someone who lives nearby. It might put a smile on their face! <p>What is your favourite type of Easter egg? Do you think you could design one which is even tastier? Now is your opportunity!</p> <p>Design your own Easter Egg.</p> <p>It could have a yummy filling, be decorated with your favourite sweets or maybe have a surprise inside!</p> <p>Draw a picture of your design and label its special features / ingredients.</p> <p>Think of a name for it and then create an advert to sell it to others. Think about all its USPs (Unique Selling Points)!</p> <p>It could be a poster advert to appear in a magazine or an advert for the television. If you want, you could even have a go at making it!</p>	<p>Collect some seeds from the fruit and vegetables you are eating. This could include apples, tomatoes and butternut squash, for example.</p> <p>Do they all look the same? Try planting them and see if they grow. (be patient!)</p> <p>You could put them in a plastic food bag with some damp tissue / cotton wool and put them on a window to watch the seeds germinate.</p> <p>You could keep a diary of how the plants change.</p>	<p>Learn how to say Happy Easter in different languages - start with French and Spanish.</p>  <p>Teach your family.</p>

Create a timeline showing the main event in your life, from the day you were born to today.




You could learn about why we celebrate Easter and make an Easter garden.
