I really hope all of you, in whatever circumstances you currently face, had the opportunity to enjoy the wonderful half term holiday weather. I know many of you will also be looking forward to the opportunity to meet more friends and family from today and I am sure we are all thinking of those who have been shielding as they now have the chance to go outdoors more frequently.

I hope all the children feel refreshed from the week away from home learning, but also determined to get back to the lessons set by their teachers. Although the school staff will be focused on the new arrangements in school for re-opening this week to more children of key workers, we do not want pupils' home learning to be disadvantaged in any way. I have already talked to staff about how we can create more links between pupils in school and those at home and share more videos and work.
