Dear Parents / Carers

Today most of the newspaper headlines relate to yesterday's announcement that not all pupils would be returning to school before September. This, unfortunately, was always likely to be the case as lack of space and staffing to implement the guidance for vastly smaller groups and all the necessary social distancing measures always led to the conclusion that going back to having 450 pupils in school before the end of term would not be possible. We all feel frustrated by the reality of the situation we are facing and I know there will be many further discussions about how schools will need to run in September, or what changes to guidance might mean even before the end of term. At this point I just wanted to tell you that I will try to keep you informed of any developments that emerge at a county wide or national level.

I am also constantly talking to staff about how they can manage in-school teaching and manage the home learning and how we can continue to develop the ways we work with you and the children. Supporting **every** pupil and family continues to be our aim, despite all the challenges.
