Hopefully you could remember how to work out 4 and 6 figure grid references and you had a go at making your own magical map.

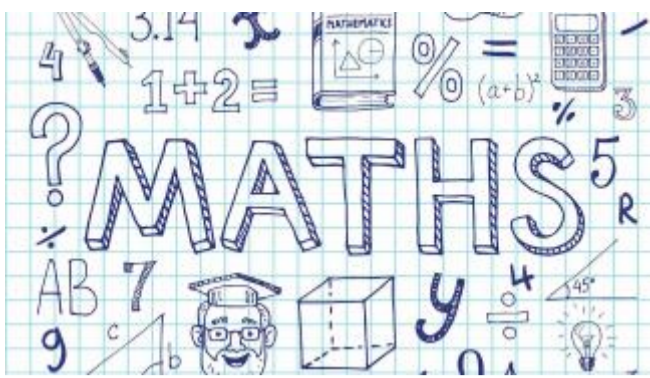
