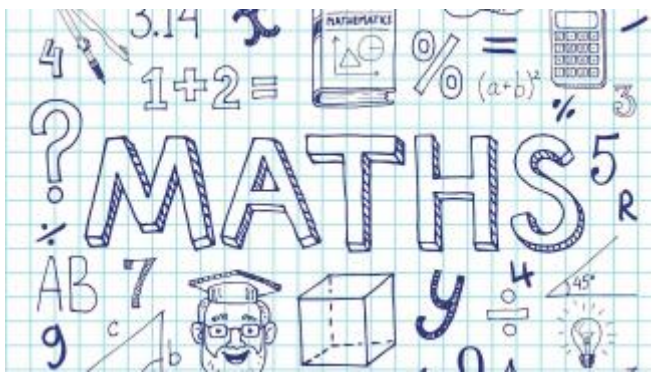
Today, we will learn more about a love of Hagrids ... dragons!
