

At Cringleford Primary, we aim to provide a high-quality geography education to inspire our children to develop a curiosity and fascination about the world and its people.

Throughout our curriculum, children learn fieldwork skills, use resources such as maps and photographs and are encouraged to ask questions to help them explore the world from a local scale to a global scale. The range of topics we cover gives our children knowledge about diverse places, people, resources and natural and human environments, together with a deep understanding of the Earth’s key physical and human processes.

As children move through the school, their growing knowledge about the world helps them to deepen their understanding of the links between physical and human processes. Our children learn that people, places and environments are connected in many ways and at many scales. By the time they reach the end of KS2, they have a good understanding of global citizenship and the impact their choices could have both in the wider world and in their local area.
