

 <p>Reading</p>	<p>This is the most important thing that you can do while you are off school. You should try and read for 15 minutes every day. Find a book that you think you'll enjoy (an old favourite, a new book or one that you've been meaning to read for ages but not got round to picking up), find somewhere comfortable and sit back and enjoy!</p> <p>You could do any of the following types of reading:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Read by yourself</li> <li>- Read aloud to an adult, a sibling or even a pet</li> <li>- Ask an adult to read to you.</li> </ul>

You can use <a href="#">Rockstars</a> or practise in any other way you like – you should know 2,5,10,3,4,8 and 6 times tables by the time you finish Year 3.</p>
