Dear Parents / Carers,

We were so pleased to welcome everyone back last week during some gloriously sunny days. So many children had been away on holiday or to visit friends and family over the Easter break and we enjoyed hearing their news.

During the recent professional development day, staff reviewed curriculum plans and we considered the reading diet for all children from EYFS through to Year 6. We are keen to include a range of writers, styles, time frames and cultures, with books which support the curriculum and some which inspire children to read. Mr McNicholas plans to create a display of the key texts in school just as he has done with examples of children's writing.

During the first half of the summer term assessments will be taking place as we engage with the national SATS, phonics and multiplication checks and as we review the children's learning and progress this year in preparation for report writing.

Collective Worship Value

This half term we shall be exploring the term 'Justice' with the children through our whole school and class collective worship. We shall be asking questions of ourselves such as – Is justice always about treating everyone exactly the same or is it more complicated than this?

Through our thinking we hope to help everyone consider how to make just and wise decisions, how seeing the whole picture and looking at things from different sides or perspectives is helpful.

General Reminders

School Site

When the whistle is blown on the playground in the mornings this is a clear indication that the school day is starting, registers are about to be taken and the gates are being locked. The gates are open from 8.40 a.m. each day and children are expected to be in class and ready to start the day at 8.50 a.m.

We would like to remind parents & carers that for the health & safety of all, it is expected that once your child has been dismissed at the end of the school day at 3:15 p.m., that you will leave the school site promptly.

Whilst we understand that the recent pleasant weather means that parents wish to wait outside for club pick-ups, and children wish to stay and play with their friends, we would ask

that you make use of the local parks and green areas to do so. Scooters & bicycles should be pushed whilst on the school site, not ridden/scooted around to avoid any accidents/incidents. Thank you for your co-operation in these matters.

Naming uniform and belongings
