This photograph shows Falcons class window with origami hearts, butterflies and dogs. They felt the hearts represented the Country's love for the Queen and her service to us. The white butterflies represent the special butterfly brooch the Queen sometimes wears and a precious photograph of her late husband with the insects.

Some people think butterflies symbolise a rebirth for the Queen after the loss of her husband Prince Phillip.

The blue dogs are to signify the Queen's love for dogs which have always been an important part of her life.

Day of Welcome

Next Friday (17th June) Mrs Dodson will lead the school in a celebration of the Day of Welcome. A Day of Welcome is a day of solidarity and learning in schools that aims to build a culture of welcome and understanding for refugees and asylum seekers.

The celebration is designed to support schools and families in marking Norwich Refugee Week (20-26th June) and to send a clear message that for those in need of sanctuary, our

We invite all children to wear something which they feel best represents who they are – something to do with their culture, identity or interests (e.g. Brownies, Cubs, Karate, Dance etc) or something in their favourite colour.

This year, alongside Norfolk Schools of Sanctuary, Welcome Wheels are asking schools to hold a non-uniform day and to gather voluntary contributions towards Welcome Wheels. Welcome Wheels is a collaborative project between three charities in Norwich that work with asylum seekers, refugees and isolated migrants and the social enterprise Bicycle Links CIC.

Welcome Wheels have provided over 350 free bikes and safety equipment to newly arrived refugee families and individuals in Norwich since 2018. This project is incredibly popular; a bike is a simple solution to many of the challenges faced by asylum seekers and refugees, some of whom are not entitled to work or receive benefits, and many of whom have experienced war, trauma and ill-health. A bike provides the means to get around the city cheaply, the free exercise keeps people active and healthy, improving wellbeing, and for some people, it can even help them find work.

Voluntary contributions will be collected by class teachers at registration on 17th June. Donations are purely voluntary, there is no requirement to do so.

Netball
