



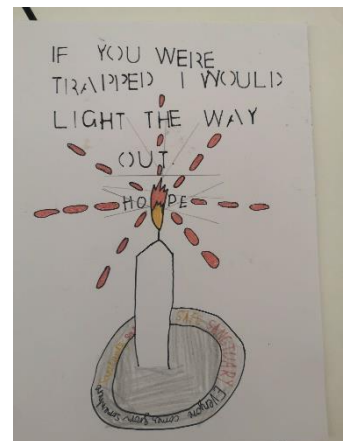
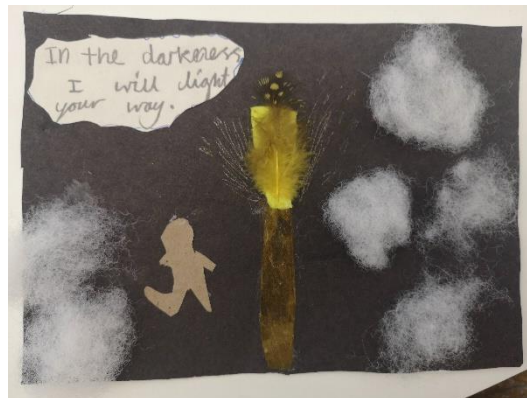
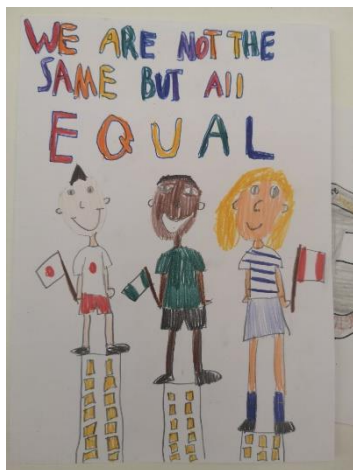

Day of Welcome

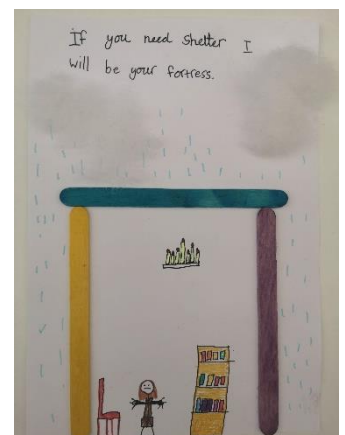
Our first Day of Welcome last week was a huge success.

We started the day with a whole school assembly. It was wonderful seeing the children dressed as what they felt best represents them and so many were so keen to proclaim where they and their family came from and what languages they speak.

Whilst celebrating the diversity of our school we also reflected on how we, as a school community, can build a culture of welcome and understanding for refugees and asylum seekers. Each class then designed a Welcome poster for their window demonstrating the languages spoken in the class.

The children also took part in different kinds of activities to engage with issues relating to refugee migration, and to understand what it means to be seeking sanctuary.

We have attached some pictures from the day and thought you would like to hear some of the comments made by pupils during the day :



“During the Day of Welcome I learnt so much, I never knew so many other languages were spoken at the school. I also learnt about how everybody deserves to feel welcome, to feel safe and learn new things” - Tala Year 5

“I never realized there were so many millions of refugees around the world. I learnt how important kindness is and how important it is for people to feel safe” - Sophia Year 6

“It deepened my understanding on what a refugee is and how terrible it must be to have to flee your home, they should all be treated like normal, respected people”- Luke Year 6

“It was so sad to hear how hard refugees’ journeys can sometimes be but I felt happy knowing that we can make them feel safe and give them a happy place to be”. - India Year 4

Big Holiday Fun

Big Norfolk Holiday Fund was previously known as HAF – Holiday activities & Food Programme. It is run by Active Norfolk in collaboration with NCC.

Their broad goals are to provide a range of activities in the school holidays for children aged 5-16 which will all include a nutritious meal and some nutritional information in every session. 4 weeks in summer, 1 week at Easter, 1 week at Christmas.

Places are free for children entitled to FSM and this summer holiday they are 48 providers offering 13,628 free school places for FSM pupils. These are now a blended offer to enable all children to access the activities, with non FSM children paying for places and helping to remove any stigma attached to the sessions. Bookings are live now via - [EveryMove](#) website.

Codes have been removed and parents can book direct which should make it much easier for everyone.
